AIMS OF MUSIC SYLLABUS

- Acquire and apply musical skills, knowledge and understanding through Listening, Creating and Performing
- Develop ability for creative expression and communication
- Develop and understanding and appreciation of music in local and global cultures
- Cultivate a life-long enjoyment and involvement in music

MUSIC CURRICULUM



The Music curriculum seeks to develop musical understanding through the **three Musical Processes** of *Listening*, *Creating* and *Performing*.

These three Musical Processes (i.e. the three overlapping circles in the centre of diagram) are core to the Curriculum Concept and are inter-related and inter-dependent in practice.

MUSIC CURRICULUM

To demonstrate understanding of musical elements and concepts, students

imitate rhythmic and melodic patterns using voice, body percussion, and classroom instruments. They will respond to various elements of music and its mood in diverse ways, demonstrating an understanding of musical elements and concepts.

- engage in exploration, creation, and improvisation of musical ideas using voice, body percussion, and classroom instrument(s).
- perform by singing with accuracy and expression, accompanied with movement, body percussion and playing of instruments at different stages.
