


Curriculum Briefing 2024 Programme for Active Learning (PAL) for P1 & P2



WHAT IS PROGRAMME FOR ACTIVE LEARNING (PAL)?


PAL is part of the school's CCE curriculum, offered to only Primary 1 and 2 students.



Together with other CCE lessons such as Form Teacher Guidance Period and CCE Mother Tongue lessons, PAL provides dedicated curriculum time for the explicit teaching and learning of values and social-emotional competencies by teachers, as well as engaging and building relationships with and among the students.


WHAT IS PROGRAMME FOR ACTIVE LEARNING (PAL)?



WHAT ARE THE OBJECTIVES OF PAL?

01 Develop well-rounded students in five learning domains

- While PAL provides learning experiences mainly in the Aesthetics and Physical domains, students are required to activate their Cognitive Thinking to complete tasks independently and think out of the box to solve problems.
- In the Moral and Social domains, they learn to make responsible decisions when faced with difficult issues and work it out together with peers who may not always have the same views as them and agree with each other.



WHAT DO PAL LESSONS LOOK LIKE FOR YOUR CHILD?

Freedom to explore, create and express themselves in their individual ways

Opportunities to work together with others Reflect on their learning experiences and apply it to other aspects of life

Space to explore and understand one's interests, character strengths and areas for improvement

Be brave to seek help, solve problems, and express gratitude to people around them

Time to play and learn joyfully with no right or wrong answers

feelings and emotions and learn how to manage them appropriately

HOW CAN PARENTS SUPPORT AND HELP?

ROLE MODEL

Model curiosity and express joy in learning with your child. Go beyond academic to explore varied areas of learning

ENCOURAGE

Provide a positive home and outdoor learning environment that welcomes play, exploration and pursuit of passion

SLOW DOWN

Slow down to smell the roses. Spend quality time with your child, to play, create and explore together, both indoors and outdoors

OPEN YOUR MIND

Encourage questions, change perspectives and acknowledge that there need not always be a right or wrong answer

EXPRESS GRATITUDE

Model positive
language, praise for
effort and express
thanks to him/her
and the
people/things
around you

ACKNOWLEDGE

Acknowledge your child's feelings and emotions. Do not brush them off. Guide and allow him/her the space to manage, regardless positive or negative.
